Many Christians have heard the story of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a pastor in Germany during the rise of Hitler. He stood up for others, actively worked against the regime of Nazism, continued to preach & write while imprisoned – dying a martyr's death.

Perhaps one idea forwarded by him was his development of the concept of 'Cheap Grace'. An excerpt from his book 'Dissident Discipleship: A Spirituality of Self-Surrender, Love of God and Love of Neighbor'

*Cheap grace is the preaching of...forgiveness without requiring repentance,
...baptism without church discipline,
...communion without confession,
...absolution without personal confession.*

*Cheap grace is...grace without discipleship,
...grace without the cross,
...grace without Jesus Christ living and incarnate.*

*Costly grace is...the gospel which must be sought again and again,
...the door at which one must knock.*

Such grace is costly...because it calls us to follow Jesus Christ.

*It is costly because it costs us our lives.
It is grace because it gives us the only true life*

These days lead us into the completion of the Epiphany season, transition us through Transfiguration Sunday and bring us into Lent. Surely every day is a proper day to contemplate the mystery and wonder of God, but once again come face-to-face with the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross for our sins. We stand in awe of God's abiding love and grace... and of what it costs God to accomplish our salvation.

Grace truly is amazing! Bonhoeffer's excerpt provides a different way to think about grace. I invite you to use it as an avenue into the moment it seeks to give. I invite you into the eternal puzzle of the cost of God's grace and His total love for us. I invite you into a journey that seeks to discover the nearly amazing mercy of God.

May it be true for you this day and each day.

Finance Update

There was a good tip by Jeffrey London in the latest issue of the Lutheran, "Focus on strengths and you will grow stronger. Focus on weaknesses and you will grow weaker." This can be applied to our church finances as well.

Following are a number of highlights from this past year that reflect our financial strengths:

- We received 75 new members, a healthy sign of growth.
- Holy Cross received a large ministry gift that will be used to enhance our technology, worship services and youth programming. We are very thankful for this gift that will benefit us for years to come.
- We continue to use our resources more efficiently; proposed changes in our mortgage for next year will help make monthly payments more manageable and trimming the 2010 budget a little will help even further.
- Our deficit has steadily declined even in this troubling economy. We are thankful for everyone's brick by brick commitments and hope this increase will be maintained through regular giving during 2010.

Our philosophy during the last five years has been to control expenses while continuing to be good stewards of mission. We have had deficits over this period, but have kept to our strength; that we are a growing church. In addition, contributions have continued to improve annually.

Here is one final thought: at a recent ELCA Church Council meeting they voted to cut the budget 10% or \$7.7 million which included 41 staff positions. Holy Cross has continued to be a tithing church and has maintained support for the synod. We can be pleased that Holy Cross has kept this commitment and can be viewed as a source of strength for the ELCA.

December 10th, 2009 Council Minutes

Ministry Gift Information (\$100,000 gift given to Holy Cross-summer of 2009)

The following technology requests were received and reported as approved by the Executive Team:

1-Piano Microphones for Balcony \$560; 2-Storage shelf for Trinity Center Sound System Rack \$65; 3-Cart for new projector \$300.00; 4-Additional portable screen for new projector \$250; 5-Preschool Requests: \$500.00 toward the cost of a new computer for the Preschool office.

A request was received and is directed to the church council with a recommendation from the Executive Team for approval: Gathering Place A/V System \$9,220 and Sanctuary Video Camera System \$7,210

Motion for Ministry Gift Request

The Gathering Place is used for overflow seating during holidays and special events, we are using dated technology to project services resulting in poor quality; new equipment would enhance the worship experience for overflow seating and provide a new permanent projector and screen that could be used for a variety of other opportunities; the Executive Committee recommends approval of this request. It was moved that we accept the request, the motion was seconded, there was discussion, was put to vote and carried.

Treasurer's Report

M. Nadolski gave the November Treasurer's Report. Contributions were \$95,145 vs \$85,963 last year mainly due to \$10,000 coming in from the pickle campaign. Giving YTD was \$855,478 an increase of 4% over prior year. Expenses \$86,389 leaving a YTD deficit of \$67,383.

2010 Budget Approval

The budget was reviewed and there was discussion. Mark is contacting Thrivent to discuss options for the re-amortizing our mortgage. There was a motion to approve the proposed 2010 Budget not to exceed \$1,050,329 pending discussion on the mortgage with Thrivent. The motion was seconded and put to vote, the motion carried. Mark presented several mortgage pay-off scenarios to get feedback from Council. Mark will be getting proposals for the next Council meeting.

Unfinished Business

Employee Handbook Change: Pg. 15 of the HCLC Employee Manual (approved 12/07) relating to service on church boards: It has been recommended that staff members not serve as voting members on any church boards. Their presence should be advisory only. The Congregational Council recommended a Continuing Resolution in the constitution to reflect this policy.

A motion was accepted at the November 2009 Council meeting stating that Melissa Rendel, our Little Lambs Attendant who occupies a staff position that does not interact with other staff on a daily basis; it was moved that we accept the nomination of Melissa Rendel as a voting member of the Preschool Board acknowledging that this departs from the Employee Handbook. It was moved that we accept a revision to the HCLC Employee Manual, there was a second and then discussion.

New Business

It was moved that the funds raised in 2010 from Good Search be hereby designated to Seela Parish, a ministry emphasis of Holy Cross Lutheran Church. The motion was seconded and put to vote and carried.

Youth: Zac has had a couple young adult events for the 20s group. Attendance is growing.

Stewardship: Cut costs in budget by using semiannual envelopes. Jack also updated Council on the Visioning meetings.

Finance: Christmas drop is set.

Preschool Board: Preschool office has been refurbished.

Pastors Report & Final Thoughts

Pastor David updated Council on the newly elected Bishop and the election process. Installation is set for March 14th at Holy Cross. Pastor David wanted to reiterate the policy that if the Menomonee Falls School District closes due to inclement weather any church events/activities would also be cancelled. The Jump Start program has started.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:06 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer.

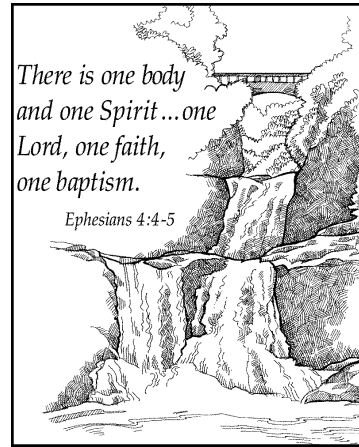
